**CUNY CHANCELLOR KIBBEE,  
WOMEN'S CITY CLUB  
SCHEDULE VISITS HERE**

Three in-depth looks at LaGuardia Community College and its various programs will begin today (March 27) when City University Chancellor Robert Kibbee visits the campus during the morning hours. Chancellor Kibbee, who regularly visits CUNY campuses, will review the College's remedial and basic skills programs.

From 9:45 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. Dr. Kibbee will review the overall remedial program with Dean Wallace Appelson, Dean of the Faculty, and Mr. Steve Brown, Assistant Professor and Coordinator of the Basic Skills Program. At 10:30 a.m., Dr. Michael Hoban, Chairman of the Natural Environment Division, will discuss the remedial mathematics program with the Chancellor and faculty from the Natural Environment Division.

At 11:00 a.m., Professor Benjamin Popper, Chairman of the Division of Communication Skills and his staff will discuss the remedial reading program with Dr. Kibbee. One-half hour later, Dr. George Groman, Chairman of the Division of Language and Culture, and his faculty members will meet with Dr. Popper and the Chancellor to discuss Remedial Writing and Special Courses.

**MIDDLE STATES EVALUATION TEAM  
TO TAKE THREE-DAY LOOK AT  
LAGUARDIA; COLLEGE SEEKS FULL  
ACCREDITATION**

A three-day visit by the evaluation team of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools has been scheduled for April 21 through April 24.

The visiting group of approximately 10 MSA members will be headed by Dr. Harry Bard, President of the Community College of Baltimore, Maryland. Following the in-depth visit, the team will decide whether or not LaGuardia Community College will receive full, final accreditation by the MSA.

The evaluation team will meet with administrators, faculty and students during their visit. Each member of the visiting group has already received a copy of the College's Middle States report which is entitled "A Self-Study." The report was prepared by Dr. Dan Ehrlich, head of the College's Institutional Research Office. (Members of the faculty and staff will receive a copy of the "Self-Study" at the next professional staff meeting scheduled for April 4.)

Dean William Hamilton, head of the Division of Student Services, and members of his faculty will meet with Dr. Kibbee at noon to discuss the basic skills counseling program.

Chancellor Kibbee will conclude his visit to LaGuardia with the College's deans.

On April 3, a committee from the Women's City Club will visit the College for a full day of interviews and discussions about the College's basic courses offerings; and its remedial programs.

The Women's City Club is currently doing a City University-wide study of the CUNY "Open Admissions" program and the group is visiting each campus.

Following a meeting with President Joseph Shenker at 10 a.m., the members of the committee will observe four classes in progress. The group will observe "Introduction to Social Science" being taught by Ms. Judy Gomez, Assistant Professor of Social Science; "Reading Tutorial 102" which will be taught by Mr. Marion Bonaparte, lecturer in the Communication Skills Division; "Basic Mathematics I" scheduled to be taught by Ms. Barbara Muir, Instructor in the Natural Environment Division; and "Writing and Literature," to be taught by Ms. Sarah Barber, Assistant Professor of Language and Culture.

Following lunch with several LaGuardia students, the committee will meet with several administrators and faculty members to discuss open admissions - entry procedures and placements, the student counseling program, remedial reading and mathematics, and the writing lab and special courses.

DR. PELTZ, MIDDLE COLLEGE HEAD,

The grant is a continuation of the Younger Humanist Fellowship received last year by Dr. Wiener.
