Fostering Visibility: Pride and Diversity in the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender Communities"

Gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender (GLBT) students, staff, and faculty have historically felt unsafe on college and university campuses. They also can feel invisible on campus and in society. As a result, GLBT students, staff, and faculty often have fears around disclosing information about themselves, and need "safe places" on campus to go when they want to talk with someone in confidence about issues, fears, questions, and concerns.

As a way of increasing visibility of gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender individuals, this exhibit has been designed to foster awareness and promote acceptance of the GLBT community. References to social and political movements and personal triumphs addressing homophobia and heterosexism are seen through examples of literature, public figures, and heroes/heroines.
