- The Agenda for the December 18, 2012, meeting was approved.
- Minutes from the November 27, 2012, meeting was approved.
- There were two matters referred for approval from the Curriculum & Academic Support Committee:
  - Proposed changes, including revised courses and establishment of new courses, to the six current degree programs, to align credits with Pathways changes to The NCC core curriculum. The programs include:
    - Associate in Arts (A.A.) in Business Administration
    - Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) in Health Information Technology
    - Associate in Arts (A.A.) Human Services
    - Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) in Information Technology
    - Associate in Arts (A.A.) Liberal Arts and Sciences
    - Associate in Arts (A.A.) Urban StudiesThe matter was approved unanimously by the Council.
  - A proposed articulation agreement with the CUNY School of Professional Studies for graduates of the NCC's A.A. degree in Urban Studies for admission into the SPS Bachelor of Arts degree in Urban and Community Studies at The Murphy Institute. The matter was approved by the Council with a vote of 16 in favor and one abstention.
- There were no referral matters from the Assessment & Professional Development Committee or the Agenda Committee.
