R E P O R T .

I.

General Remarks.

The Board of Education of the City and County of New York, in pursuance of the provisions of Subdivision 7, of Section 3, of Chapter 386, of the Laws of 1851, respectfully present to the Common Council of the City of New York, and to the Board of Regents of the University of the State, this, their Third Annual Report of the operations and condition of the Free Academy in said city.

Since the date of the last report of the Board, the Free Academy has been called to mourn the loss, by death, of its learned and able Professor of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy, EDWARD C. ROSS, LL. D. With a mind liberally endowed by nature, highly improved by culture, and greatly enriched by the treasures gathered in patient and long continued inves-

tigation and research, Professor Ross, although he had yet scarcely passed the meridian of life, had already attained a very elevated position in his profession, and which promised, in the future, still higher distinction and usefulness. With a singular adaptedness to his particular pursuits, he possessed, in a very eminent degree, the rare and valuable talent for teaching—a peculiar facility in transferring to the minds of others the rich treasures of his own. To these high qualities, he added a kindness of nature and gentleness of manner, that endeared him to his pupils, and conciliated the respect and affection of all. In his peculiar pursuit, and particular department of knowledge, Professor Ross has left behind him few equals, and still fewer, if any, superiors in our country; and his memory will long be cherished by the Free Academy, and his death viewed as a very great loss to that young institution.

The Board of Education took the occasion of the vacancy thus created in the Professorship of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy, to accomplish what they had for some time contemplated, and which had already become necessary, a division of the combined Professorship of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy into two distinct Professorships, one of Mathematics, and one of Natural Philosophy. The progress of the classes in the institution, in their prescribed course of studies, already rendered this a measure not merely of expediency, but of necessity.

The Board, therefore, from the combined Professorship, created a distinct Professorship of Mathematics, and one of Natural Philosophy. To the former, the able and faithful Assistant Professor in the original combined Professorship, Gerardus Beekman Docharty, LL.D., was appointed as Professor; and immediately entered upon a discharge of his duties as such Professor. To the latter was appointed, as Professor, Lieutenant William B. Franklin, a distinguished graduate of the United States Academy at West Point, and for several years past an Assistant Professor, in the corresponding department in that institution. Professor Franklin accepted this appointment, but from his peculiar engagements at the moment, could not enter upon a discharge of its duties until the commencement of the term in February next.

From the increased number of Students admitted into the Academy, and the consequent increase in the labors of instruction therein, the Faculty, in its other departments, required to be reinforced by the appointment of additional teachers. But such appointments, with a single exception, could

not at the moment be satisfactorily made. The instruction of the institution, therefore, has, during the past term, proceeded under the former Faculty, with the single addition above mentioned. This has necessarily thrown upon the Faculty, in all its principal departments, a very considerably increased amount of labor; but by the assiduous self-devotion and extraordinary exertions of the Faculty, in its several departments, the instruction of the institution has been conducted with undiminished efficiency and success; so that it is believed that the Academy was never in a condition more prosperous or gratifying to the wishes and hopes of its founders and friends, and never more fully accomplished its true objects, or realized the just expectations of the public.

It is creditable to the instruction and discipline in the Free Academy, that as its classes advance in their prescribed course of studies, fewer of their members are turned back on account of deficiency. It is also creditable to the instruction of the Common Schools, from which the students in the Free Academy are exclusively drawn, that of the applicants for admission into the Academy, the number rejected is gradually diminishing; so that, both in its direct action and indirect influence, the Free Academy is accomplishing the beneficent objects of its institution.

II.

Results of the last two Examinations.

Since the last report to the Common Council of the City of New York, and the Regents of the University, two examinations for advancement and two examinations for admission have been held at the Free Academy.

At the examination for advancement held from January 6th to January 18th, 1851,

Class A consisted of 25 students, of whom 25 were advanced, and
0 " turned back.

Class B consisted of 41 students, of whom 27 were advanced, and
14 " turned back.

Class C consisted of 50 students, of whom 32 were advanced, and
18 " turned back.

Class D consisted of 108 students, of whom 39 were advanced, and
69 " turned back.

At the examination for admission, from January 20th, to January 30th, 1850, 158 candidates were presented, of whom

III.

New Regulation.

The Board has also, since its last report, adopted the following regulation :

" 24. After 1852, there shall be no January examination for admissions ; and no student shall be admitted unless he shall have attended the Common Schools eighteen months ; and, in addition to the present studies, shall pass a good examination in Algebra as far as Simple Equations, inclusive."

Under the operation of this regulation, the students hereafter admitted into the Free Academy will be better prepared for the course of studies to be there pursued ; and will of course profit more largely by the higher instruction given in that institution.
