

Beame Dedication Is Set

New York City Mayor Abraham D. Beame will be the principal speaker at the official dedication of the four new buildings constructed at a cost of over \$65-million at BC, on Friday, April 26.

Mayor Beame will lead a host of dignitaries at the dedication ceremonies, scheduled to begin at 11 a.m. on the Plaza Building Portico.

Other speakers at the ceremonies will include Brooklyn Borough President Sebastian Leone, City University of New York Chancellor Robert Kibbee, BC President John W. Kneller, and CLAS student government President Mark Isacoff. Rabbi Frank Fischer will deliver the invocation and the Brooklyn College Symphonic Band will perform.

The four new buildings being dedicated, which went into use last fall, contain more than one million square feet of usable space. Begun in 1969 under the direction of the State Dormitory Authority, the buildings include:

- **William James Hall**, a six-story classroom building housing the colleges School of Education, the Psychology and Sociology Departments, offices of the Dean of the School of Social Science and the School of General Studies, the college's evening division.

- **Plaza Building**, containing classrooms, lecture halls, a six-lane olympic-size swimming pool, sports facilities and the college's Computer Center. It is connected to the main campus by a soaring, 34-step pedestrian bridge over Bedford Avenue and its roof is a spacious plaza of sitting areas and greenery.

- **Ingersoll Hall** addition, housing new laboratories, research areas, lecture halls, and a rooftop greenhouse, making it one of the best science facilities in the city.

- **Roosevelt Hall** addition, featuring new men's and women's gymnasiums, classrooms and offices and novel facilities such as a dance studio with television filming capabilities; greatly expands the college's physical education capacity.
