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## World Literature II: Digital Essay Project

For this last assignment of the semester, choose ONE of the following questions to explore:

- To what extent has the concept of feminism changed over the years?
- What is missing from any, or all, of these arguments?

### Requirements:

- You must cite all your sources either with hyperlinks to the original text or MLA format in-text citations.
- 3 – 4 page essay
- The essay on your website needs to have a unique title that lets the reader know your main idea or purpose.
- You must have a central claim or thesis that you clearly articulate in your first paragraph.
- You must have at least TWO visual or interactive elements that develop or serve your essay's argument.

### Grading: You will be graded on the following:

- Your essay makes sense. It's organized and has a main point, which is unique to your interpretation (60%).
- Use source material effectively to clarify and/or explain your points (20%).
- Cite source material correctly (10%) (but if you don't cite, you will fail the paper)
- Your creative element is not just something you slapped on at the last minute to make your website pretty, but instead helps pull all your ideas together (10%).
