

# *Second Work-Study Summer Session Now Being Planned*

Brooklyn College is now planning its second year's work-study summer session, to be held at the Agriculture Institute at Morrisville, in Madison County, central New York State. At a meeting last Friday in Room 2310I. President Gideonse addressed those interested in the project and motion pictures on the social life at Morrisville were shown.

The daily routine calls for rising at 6:00 a. m., eating breakfast at 6:45, and at 7:45 travelling by truck to the specified destination where the actual farm work, consisting of picking peas and beans at 50c per bushel takes place. The trip covers an average of 7 miles. All student-farmers quit work at 5:30.

Expenses of \$2 for a room and \$5 for a meal ticket are deducted from the salary which is determined by the number of bushels picked.

In the evening classes are held during which a maximum of five academic credits may be taken. Most students find three credits plenty!

Morrisville, a township of no more than 700, presents a weekly movie in the firehouse, as the nearest legitimate movie house is eight miles away.
