

STUDENTS TO WORK FARMS

Brooklyn College Prepares for Its Third Season Up-State

Brooklyn College is preparing for its third farm-labor summer project in Madison County, N. Y., with headquarters at the State Technical and Agricultural Institute in Morrisville, Harry D. Gideonse, president of the college, announced yesterday.

A fifty-two page booklet titled "A Brooklyn Bridge to Morrisville" was issued yesterday. It recorded the achievements of last summer's session and gave plans for the coming season.

Prof. Ralph C. Benedict of the Department of Biology, who directed the project last year, called for collaboration of the Board of Higher Education and the State Department of Education in establishment of a joint urban-rural program to parallel the recently announced labor-management program to be set up at Cornell.
