CONTRACT NO. 4. ELECTRIC WORK AND CERTAIN LIGHTING FIXTURES FOR ACADEMIC BUILDING;

CONTRACT NO. 4-A. ELECTRIC WORK AND CERTAIN LIGHTING FIXTURES FOR SCIENCE BUILDING, INCLUDING GREENHOUSE.

CONTRACT NO. 4-B. LIGHTING FIXTURES FOR ACADEMIC, SCIENCE AND GREENHOUSE AND LIBRARY BUILDINGS,—FOR BROOKLYN COLLEGE, BOROUGH OF BROOKLYN, CITY OF NEW YORK.

This contract is to be financed wholly by a loan and grant by the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Emergency Relief Appropriation Act of 1935, the Executive Orders of the President of the United States issued pursuant thereto, and to the rules and regulations prescribed by the President of the United States, the Works Progress Administration or the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.

Attention of the bidders is particularly called to the requirements as to the minimum wage rates to be paid under this contract.

Bids must be submitted in sealed envelopes.

Bidders are warned that the contractor will be required to perform, directly and without subcontracting, not less than 25 per cent. of the construction, to be calculated on the basis of the total contract price, and that no part of the contract shall be sublet without the approval of the Board of Higher Education and the State Director for the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.

The time allowed for doing and completing the entire work and for the full performance of each contract is two hundred and seventy-five (275) consecutive calendar days.

The security required for the faithful performance of this contract shall be a performance bond in an amount equal to one hundred per cent. (100%) of the contract price, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract.

The amount of deposit to accompany each bid shall be not less than five per cent. (5%) of the amount of the bid. The form of acceptable security is given in the Instructions to Bidders.

The bidder for each contract shall state one aggregate price for the whole work described and specified, as it is entire for a complete job.

Items (a), (b) and (c) under Contract No. 4-B in the bid must all be filled in, but in awarding said contract bids will be compared on the basis of the lump sum bid, which must be the total of items (a), (b) and (c).

No award of the contract will be made without the prior approval of the State Director of the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.

Bidders are required to make their bids upon the blank forms prepared by the Board of Higher Education, a copy of which with the proper envelope to enclose the bid, together with a copy of the contract documents including specifications in form approved by the Corporation Counsel can be obtained upon application at the office of Randolph Evans, architect; Corbett, Harrison & MacMurray, associated architects, 140 Nassau st., Borough of Manhattan, where plans which are a part of the specifications may be seen.

Bidders who desire a separate set of plans for their own use may obtain them on payment of the cost of printing the additional copies. Such copies will remain the property of the bidder.

The Board reserves the right to waive any informalities in or to reject any and all bids, subject to the approval of the State Director.

No bidder may withdraw his bid within 45 days after the submission thereof.

The architect's estimate of the cost of the work to be done under the contracts is as follows: Contract No. 4, \$106,000; Contract No. 4-A, \$246,000; Contract No. 4-B, \$100,000.
