

FACTS CONCERNING B. C. SUMMER FARM SCHOOL

Place: Morrisville, N. Y., 260 miles from New York City, 25 miles east of Syracuse, town of 500; no movies.

Transportation: Provided by state.

Time: About June 15 until about September 15. Students will be expected to remain for the whole time.

Living Conditions: Dormitories and cafeteria of State Agricultural School. Students will live two in a room and take care of their rooms and laundry. Friends may room together.

Living Cost: \$1 per day; room deposit of \$5 will be refunded at end of summer.

Earnings: Minimum of \$7 a week; probable daily average for eight hours at current piece work rates; \$3.50; depends on ability to pick and weather conditions.

Kind of Work: Picking peas and string beans.

Insurance: Full accident coverage for summer for \$3 premium.

Summer School: Everyone must carry one 3 or 4 credit course under one of the following headings; prescribed Freshman and Sophomore courses, war service courses, or special courses appropriate to the farm situation. The same fees will be paid as if the courses were taken at the college.

Recreation: Athletics, swimming, group activities.

Qualifications: Satisfactory completion of at least one semester at B. C., excellent health, good work habits, ability to adjust to the requirements of group living. It will not be possible to accommodate younger brothers or sisters, and probably not even friends from other colleges.

Registration: Preliminary cards are now being filled out in the Placement Office; parents' consent required; members of Employment Committee will interview applicants after April 15.
