The enclosed introduction and preliminary summary are presented as excerpts from a written report on the Brooklyn College Farm Labor Project for 1943, now in preparation.

Two pictorial reports of the same Project are now ready and will be offered for inspection within the next few days.

(1) A motion picture record of the summer's activities, produced by Mr. Arnold Eagle and Miss Kathryn Benedict, with the assistance of Professor Edward Fleisher and Mr. Jacob Foster. This picture will be shown first to staff members in Room 1310 Boylan, between 3:00 and 4:30 P.M. on Friday, December 3rd. It will be shown to student workers and their parents from 3:00 to 6:00 P.M. in Room 1310 Boylan on Sunday, December 5th. On the latter occasion, there will also be a demonstration of student activities in Room 0200 Boylan.

(2) A photographic record of the Project in fifty still pictures, mostly taken by Mr. Eagle. These have been selected, arranged, and mounted by Professor Serge Chermayeff. They will be placed on exhibit at first in Room 0200 Boylan.

Members of the College staff are cordially invited to be present at either or both of the occasions. Because a large number of parents and students are expected on Sunday, two showings of the film are planned, at 3:00, and at 4:30 P.M. Dr. M. B. Galbreath, Director of the Institute at Morrisville is to speak briefly at the Friday meeting. Officials of State and Federal farm placement agencies are expected to be present on both dates.
