**BROOKLYN'S NEW  
COLLEGE OPENS****Faculty Drawn From Hunter  
and C. C. N. Y.****FORMAL CEREMONY WAIVED****Death of Guider Causes Change  
of Plans.**

At 9 o'clock this morning the doors of the new Brooklyn College were opened to admit the first group of students. It is just twenty-two days since the Board of Higher Education was definitely notified that it could utilize the space in the Willoughby Building at the corner of Willoughby and Bridge streets.

According to a statement issued to-day by Frederick B. Robinson, acting president of the College of the City of New York and provost of the Board of Higher Education, the opening ceremony at which the late Borough President Joseph A. Guider was to have handed over a golden key of the building to the college authorities, will be indefinitely postponed, due to the sudden death of Mr. Guider. The student body filed in quietly to-day without formal exercises.

The provost and the associate provost, Dr. George Davis, president of Hunter College, obtained teachers from the College of the City of New York and Hunter College to conduct work for boys and girls respectively.
