1. Minutes

The minutes of the meeting of December 17, 1981 were approved.

2. Report from University Senate - Dr. Galub distributed copies of a Form Letter on OMB Circular A - 21 (dealing with a proposed distinction between sponsored research and the on-going research of faculty, and the method of documenting charges for personal services) which he suggested be sent by individual faculty members to the Office of Management and Budget in Washington expressing support for the proposed change.

3. President James J. Colston - In Memoriam

Dr. Prince distributed copies of a letter of condolence which he wrote to Mrs. Colston on January 28, 1982 on behalf of the faculty, staff and students of Bronx Community College.

The following resolution:

WHEREAS, Dr. James A. Colston won forever the love and respect of this College community as President and President Emeritus of Bronx Community College, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Colston is also remembered as a strong and active friend of all the communities served by the College, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Colston's efforts to help the College and its manifold activities never ceased, and are recalled with particular affection, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Colston's long career in higher education was marked by unfailing energetic devotion and splendid contributions, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Colston's remarkable human qualities, his spiritual vigor, and his ability to seek and find common ground with those he encountered, magnified his undeniable stature as an administrator and educational leader, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Colston's priceless warmth, inspiration, and comradeship sustained us all and will be sorely missed at this institution, which he served so well, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Bronx Community College Senate expresses its deep sorrow over Dr. Colston's death, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the work of the College will go forward in the spirit which moved Dr. Colston's own work, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this resolution, together with the profoundest expression of our sympathy, be conveyed to the family of Dr. Colston.

4. Committee Reports

- a) Executive Committee: - Dr. Prince reported that he had sent letters to department chairpersons requesting lists of names of candidates who would be willing to sit on committees, to fill current and future vacancies.
- b) Committee on Governance and Elections: - Prof. Howard Fuld reported the Committee's interpretation of how student members should be elected to the College Committees by the Student Council:

"Student representation on College Committees which call for elected by the Student Council from the student body is interpreted by the Committee to mean "at large representation."

"At-large" representation is further interpreted by the Committee to mean "members of the student body who are not members of the Senate."

Motion: To accept the above interpretation for student membership.
Motion defeated.

Motion: To interpret the words "student body", as referring to any student.

Motion carried: 18 YES 8 NO 4 ABSTENTIONS

- c) Curriculum Committee
Lay Advocate Option of Paralegal Studies Program.
Option B of the Audio-Visual Technology Program.
Motion to approve the above programs as received was carried unanimously.

d) Committee on Academic Standing -

A report submitted by Mr. H. Erdanecker at the December Senate meeting was moved as follows:

Students returning from suspension may not exceed a program load of 10 degree or non-degree credits.

Motion carried unanimously.

5. Dr. Prince distributed copies of the Second Draft Statement of Goals and Objectives of the College so that senate members could familiarize themselves with the contents. Action will be taken at the next meeting of the Senate.
6. As there was no new business, a motion to adjourn was unanimously carried.
