- 2) Motion to deny Maryann Gavrielatos permission to register for the Summer Session 1986. Motion was passed 7-0-6.


III. GRADUATION

- B) Motion to award A.A. Degrees, A.A.S. Degrees, and Certificates to students who have completed all requirements for their respective curriculums. Motion passed 16-0-0.
- C) Doubtful Cases:
 - 1) Terrance McFarlane
Motion to remove two F grades by statute of limitations. Motion approved 12-0-3. The resulting index was above 2.0 and the degree was awarded.
 - 2) Susana Walter
Motion to award degree. Motion passed 15-0-1.

IV. OTHER BUSINESS

- A) Committee Thanks. Motion to thank the Registrar's staff for their preparation of the student grades and transcripts for the CAS meeting. Motion passed by acclamation.
- B) Committee Letter. Motion to send a letter to Dean Carl Polowczyk expressing the committee's disapproval with the schedule for graduation. There was not enough time between the end of exams and the CAS graduation meeting (and graduation) to prepare most student transcripts for Committee review. Motion passed 15-0-1.
