MINUTES OF CUNY SERIALS LIBRARIANS MEETING  
FRIDAY, NOV. 11, 2005

- 1) Pat Young: serials training for Version 16 will focus on items and searching in the new gui; let Pat know of other topics that need to be covered.
- 2) Susan Vaughn:
  - a) Springer has bought Kluwer, and is offering CUNY a package with access to about 1200 titles. A trial is now available. Each campus can decide on its own; once a library has accepted, Springer representatives will generate invoices. There are minimum participation rates, for community colleges \$2000, for the rest \$5000, with a 10% surcharge for print. It is possible to pay through EBSCO.
  - b) The Central Office will pay \$35,000 toward our Elsevier bill, but libraries should pay their individual invoices, with the \$35,000 to be apportioned at a later time.
- 3) Carol Gee brought up the possibility of transferring serial titles to Coutts. Several libraries have been offered at least a 6% discount, with no shipping charges. A task force of Mike Waldman, Carol Gee, Francine Egger-Sider and Sharon Swacker (appointed in absentia) will look into this.
- 4) Lisa Finder suggested moving the Serials Committee to LACUNY. After some discussion, the motion to move carried unanimously. A mission statement will be required.
- 5) holdings standards - additional training for holdings was discussed. It was decided that the best alternative would be to have a separate program, in the spring, with an invited speaker, to which clerical staff will be invited.
- 6) EBSCO - Susan O'Leary demonstrated the ejournals module on EBSCONET.
