*** 3 years or more high school language-none; all others, 4-8 credits, (2 years high school-4 credits; 1 or no years high school-8 credits).

A year sequence in conversational Spanish is suggested for those students planning a sub-doctoral career in psychology and for professionally oriented students who plan to work with a Spanish speaking community.

Paraprofessional candidates with a Spanish background will take the Modern Language fluency examination. If they pass it, they may not take the course in conversational Spanish, but may substitute any free elective totaling the same number of credits.

IV. Curriculum Revision - Nursing

Prof. Levy reviewed the need for the one credit Art Survey or Music Survey course in the Nursing Curriculum. It was to fulfill a 1 credit requirement in the area of Art and Music for the AAS degree in Nursing.

It was moved and seconded to approve the addition of a 1 credit course, either Art Survey or Music Survey, to the AAS curriculum in Nursing.

V. New Course, Department of Secretarial Studies - Business Communication (3 hours-3 credits)

Prof. Farrelly explained the need for the course. It was to prepare secretaries for occupational functions, such as composing business letters, memorandum, and reports for employers. The courses would also aid in developing good English usage applicable to business.
