TO THE CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

Note: The meeting of Thursday, October 18, 1973 was recessed and continued on October 25, 1973 at which time the meeting was recessed again recessed and concluded on October 31, 1973. This unusual procedure developed as a result of the committee's need to give full consideration to proposals and programs developed by the Office of Continuing Education and Community Services during the summer months, when the Sub-Committee did not meet in regular session. Sub-Committee members were consulted informally and by mail during the summer months whenever program requirements so dictated. Not all of the Sub-Committee members were present at each segment of the recessed meeting, but a quorum was maintained at each session, and each Sub-Committee member attended at least two of the three segments of the meeting.


IV. New Proposals
