MINUTES OF COMMITTEE ON INSTRUCTION - MARCH 21, 1972

Dr. Berger called the meeting to order at 2:40 p.m. Minutes of the last meeting ( Mar. 7) were approved as distributed in the mail. Anyone who wishes to make any correction to the minutes may do so in writing to the secretary.

The next meeting of the Instruction Committee will be held on April 18, announced the Chairman.

Prof. Hirshfield informed the Committee that copies of the Ad Hoc Committee Resolutions and the University of California questionnaire sample will be distributed soon to the entire faculty. A meeting on the Questionnaire will be held on April 10 at 4 p.m.

Dr. Berger reported on the Joint meeting to discuss community service. We may debate on this question in a future meeting, said Dr. Berger.

Prof. Hirshfield said that he was frankly pleased that the Instruction Committee is now forced into a role of policy making. A resolution has just been introduced to remove accessibility of collected information to the students. A tear-off sheet was introduced to accompany the questionnaire. The only three copies of data on file may not be photocopied or removed.

Discussion continued on problems associated with the questionnaire, e.g.

- 1) the area of law and mandate on the use and interpretation of data,
- 2) the link between student evaluation and faculty promotion and re-appointment,
- 3) the extent to which the faculty is really involved in the questionnaire,
- 4) whether results of the questionnaire are to be treated as "important" or "not important".

As the first part of the meeting was over, the secretary had to leave. Prof. Frank was asked to take over the recording of events at the Joint Meeting with the Center for Humanistic Education held at the Fordham Faculty Lounge from 3:30 to 5:50 p.m.
