MINUTES OF COMMITTEE ON INSTRUCTION _ DECEMBER 11, 1972

As the meeting began at 3:15 p.m., the Chairman announced that there will be only one more meeting this semester - the meeting on January 8, 1973. Then, he wrote the tentative dates of the February and March meetings on the blackboard as follows:

A letter and a petition for signatures were circulated regarding the Council of Learning seeking affiliation with the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges. The Chairman said that Dean Donovan asked that those who endorse the idea may want to sign the petition.

Professor Hirshfield reported on recent developments in the work of the Ad Hoc Committee on Student Evaluation. During the last two meetings of this Ad Hoc Committee only two students managed to be present, he noted.

Professor Hynes reported on the Committee on Remediation and the highlights of the meeting at Glenmont. Dean Donovan confirmed that money has been approved for five of the seven categories of suggested expenditures.

Mr. Gold reported that the deadline for submitting material for the Journal for Improvement of Instruction is next week. However, enough material has been collected for the first issue.

Dr. Ryan reported on Effective Instruction in the New Campus. A memorandum will be drafted to acknowledge suggestions made on this problem, he said.

Lastly, Professor Stein gave a talk on the Keller Method of Instruction, from 4:25 to 5:00 p.m. when the meeting had to be adjourned because of time.
