The meeting began at 3:15 p.m. Dr. Berger announced that the next meeting will be held on Monday, February 26, at 3:00-5:00 p.m., although the room assigned to us next semester is yet to be determined.

From 4:00-5:00 p.m., Professors Baskind and Matthew spoke on the S.T.I.R. program as described in this month's Faculty Bulletin (Vol. XI, No. 4, p. 3) On the basis of their own feelings, several students from the project who were present at the meeting, testified favorably with regard to Project S.T.I.R.
