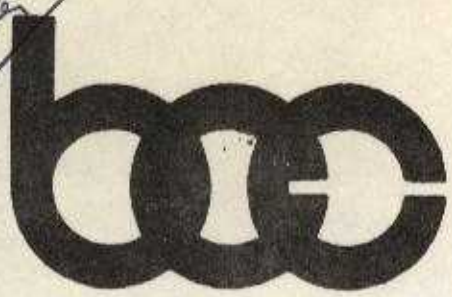


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MINUTES OF INSTRUCTION COMMITTEE MEETING, TUES. OCT. 20, 1975

The meeting began at 3:45 p.m. Dr. Berger distributed copies of 200 questions of the "Cafeteria Style" Questionnaire to those who did not receive a copy last time the Committee met. The Committee continued its ongoing discussion on whether to endorse the proposal to make the new questionnaire available to the faculty in general.

Next, it was agreed that elections for officers would be held at our next meeting, Oct. 28.

The next item of discussion was increased class size and its effects on instruction. It was decided that a survey be made of the faculty, asking whether they felt that the increase in class size and curtailment of supplies and services is significantly impairing effective instruction. Also, the faculty could be invited to report anonymously if they wish, any undue burdens or complaints regarding instruction. It is hoped, said Dr. Berger, that the Instruction Committee be viewed by the faculty as a useful instrument and an ally.

Lastly, the Chairman distributed and we discussed an article from the New York Times entitled "Study Rebuffs A View of Minority Learning" (Oct. 15, 1975) before adjourning the meeting at 5 p.m.
