COMMITTEE ON SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL AID TO STUDENTS

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF MAY 26, 1964 - 11 A.M.

The meeting commenced at 11 A. M. and was attended by Dr. Wilkinson, the Chairman, Prof. Brickman, Dr. Chang, Prof. Takei and Mr. Wong.

1. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as submitted.
2. The Chairman announced that the Committee's report read by her at the Faculty Council Meeting (May 21) has been approved and accepted. The question was then brought up as to whether the National Defense Student Loans should be integrated with the Scholarship Fund and charges against the NESL (i.e. one-tenth of the total loans to students) taken out of the Scholarship Fund.
3. Next, Dr. Wilkinson reported that she is interviewing students for the Lucy Stone Scholarship Funds. In September she plans to interview students for the Essie Gansson Nursing Scholarship Fund (Mrs. Garfunkel, executive) because these scholarships are designated for first-year students only.
4. According to correspondence from the Mayor's Committee, eight students from our college have applied for scholarship aid from the Mayor's Committee. (One has already been accepted definitely.) Of these eight students, six are candidates in the Tuition Scholarship category (i.e. aid on the basis of good grades). Two are candidates in the Incentive Award category (i.e. aid on the basis of need, not academic achievement). The Committee recommended that if any of the students should be accepted by the Mayor's Committee in the fall, our College should grant a maximum of \$100 per student per semester (this sum to be matched by the Mayor's Committee) so that the maximum total aid a student will get is \$200 per semester.
5. Money paid to students who type letters for the "Hobbies For All Ages" Project previously came from the Grand Street Funds. Now that this source of funds is no longer available, the Committee recommends that Dean Tauber try to arrange for money for this purpose.
6. The Chairman read two letters from President Meister:
  - (a) One letter indicated a donation of \$100 to the College from Mr. Charles Bensley.
  - (b) The other contained a list of the names of persons honored in our scholarship awards from funds given to our College by Friends of Public Education of the Bronx Inc. (formerly the United Local School Board of the Bronx).
7. Prof. Krey stopped by for a moment to report that letters of thanks are being sent to those in the cast of the Fashion Show. Pictures of the cast have been ordered for every one in the show. A letter was received from Dr. McLaurin who expressed his appreciation for having been invited to the Show.



Finally, there was some discussion of how the College might honor donors and contributors. Perhaps a plaque on the wall for donors' names might be a good idea; or some donor might like to donate a plaque for our use.

The meeting adjourned at noon.
