Minutes of Meeting held January 11, 1967

1. Mrs. Bullard called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. The minutes of the December meeting were accepted with one correction - the addition of Prof. Wong's name to the list of those present.
2. A letter from Dr. Colston was read to the Committee. It gave approval to the \$1.50 per hour rate for work on-campus, and \$2.00 per hour for work off-campus, effective July 1, 1967.
3. Scholarships - One application for a scholarship was presented for consideration. The applicant is a good student in the Business and Commerce Curriculum. She is one of a family of six. The family income is about \$3500.00 per year. She has asked for \$600.00 to sustain her needs in and out of school for the Spring term. The Committee passed unanimously a motion that she be given \$300.00 in scholarship funds and \$300.00 in Educational Opportunity Grant funds.
4. Deferred Tuition - In the Fall, about thirty-six loans were made. Not all money has been returned. Should the Committee act to debar a non-matriculated student who does not repay? It was moved and passed to investigate whether the Committee may ask to have such students debarred during the semester, rather than wait and deny him the right to register for the following term.
5. Money For Non-Matrics - Contracts to encourage Full Utilization of Educational Talent may provide money to help non-matrics gain matriculation or necessary training. Should we of B.C.C. enter into a program which may provide financial aid to non-matrics? (Thus far, we have considered non-matrics eligible for deferred tuition only.) After some discussion, the Committee leaned toward offering assistance only to the goal-oriented non-matric; the one who was seeking to obtain matriculation and has financial need. It was moved and passed that a proposal for a contract be submitted to the Government for a year of trial to be instituted in September, and that our Chairman discuss the problem with Dr. Colston prior to working up the proposal.

The meeting adjourned at 1:55 p.m.
