- a. Dr. Ryan suggested to postpone further discussion about changes in the catalog. Since a significant number of CUNY's options do not appear in the NYS Inventory of Registered Programs, it may be prudent to wait until this matter is clarified.
- b. Mr. Glasser noted that the new registration system, which is being implemented on a trial basis, will stop students who do not meet course prerequisites. Dr. Donnangelo added that notations with respect to prerequisites are misleading and need to be corrected.

V. NEW BUSINESS

a. Professor Gillespie discussed a dual/joint degree program with Lehman College. The document presented reflects 5 years of negotiation. The program, which leads to the ASS Degree in Education and the BA or BS Degree with a minor in Elementary and Early Childhood Education, seeks to attract minority students into teaching mathematics and sciences. Professor Gillespie requested a quick approval.

- b. The Department of Music and Art proposed a change in the ART 86 course description. In keeping with a changing marketplace, this modification imparts a computer orientation to the course in question. This routine change was approved unanimously after deleting the last line of the new course description.
- c. The Department of Engineering Technology proposed a revision of the A.A.S. degree program in Electrical Technology. The proposed routine changes were approved unanimously after minor typographical errors were corrected.
