

MINUTES OF THE ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIFTH PLENARY SESSION OF  
THE UNIVERSITY FACULTY SENATE OF THE CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK

November 19, 1991

I. A motion was made, seconded, and passed dispensing with the formal agenda.

II. Introductions: Chair Picken introduced special guests of the Senate. Professor Ethyle R. Wolfe (Classics, Brooklyn, emerita) and Professor Umberto Cañate (Mathematics, Hostos) were introduced as the co-chairs of the UFS Advisory Committee on the College Preparatory Initiative.

A special presentation was made to Professor Charlotte F. Muller. A framed copy of the resolution passed at the May 14, 1991, meeting recognizing Dr. Muller's work was presented. The resolution is as follows:

Resolution of appreciation for Dr. Charlotte F. Muller

- Whereas: Dr. Charlotte F. Muller came to the City University in 1967 in the department of economics at the Graduate School and University Center and subsequently affiliated with the Mt. Sinai School of Medicine; and
- Whereas: Dr. Muller has compiled an outstanding record as a researcher in the area of the delivery of medical services with a distinguished publication record; and
- Whereas: Dr. Muller has provided extraordinary service to the faculty of the City University of New York as Faculty Senator for the Graduate School, in numerous departmental committees, and through her participation, including service as Chair, in the Faculty Advisory Council to the Research Foundation and in the faculty delegation to the Board of Directors of the Research Foundation; and
- Whereas: All of the above were performed with grace, good cheer, determination, and intelligence in the best traditions of the Academy; therefore be it
- Resolved: That the University Faculty Senate of the City University of New York extends its appreciation to Dr. Charlotte F. Muller for her

exemplary service to her field, to faculty governance, and to the City University and offers its best wishes for an active and fulfilling retirement.

Chair Picken introduced Professor James Chen, Geneseo, President of the University Faculty Senate of the State University of New York. Professor Chen commented that he had been reading the UFS Minutes and was quite impressed with the level of knowledge and input of the UFS as compared with its SUNY counterpart. He noted that SUNY and CUNY Executive Committees will be meeting in December to discuss the issues of preparation for college, articulation, and action on the budget.

III. Presentation: Chair Picken introduced Mr. James K. W. Tchen, Director of the Asian/American Center at Queens College. The full text of Mr. Tchen's remarks is appended.
