
1. Call to Order. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson, Dr. James Ryan.

3. Minutes. The minutes of March 2, 1976 were approved with the following addition:

4. Correspondence.
 - A. The March 30, 1976 meeting of the Curriculum Committee will be held in Gould Annex 201. All meetings during the month of April will be held in South Hall Conference Room.
 - B. The Chair has received a questionnaire on the work of the Curriculum Committee from Prof. L. Lieberman, Chairman, Committee on Governance Structure and Function.
 - C. Dr. R. King, Chairman, Department of Communication Arts and Science has notified the Curriculum Committee that CMS 12 (Public and Group Communication) and CMS 10 (Speech Clinic) are being dropped from the department's offerings.
 - D. Dr. N. Eagle has requested that a member of the Curriculum Committee serve on the Student Opinion Survey Committee. Since B. Reshen and G. Riley are already members of that committee, no other person was designated.
 - E. Acting President M. Rosenstock has invited Chairperson J. Ryan to serve on the Ad Hoc Committee on Institutional Research.
5. Curriculum Revision: Executive Secretary Option (Secretarial Studies)
Prof. B. Ettinger distributed pattern sheets and a listing of liberal arts courses included for each of the four options under discussion. She summarized the department's rationale for the proposed revisions.

Dr. M. Salzberg, Chairman, Department of Music and Art presented a detailed opposition statement to the proposed curricula changes. He questioned the educational validity of these changes, and noted various inconsistencies between the stated course purposes and their subsequent use in various patterns. A lengthy discussion followed.

The Department of Secretarial Studies was amenable to Professor J. D'Andrea's suggestion to group liberal arts electives and free electives so that students would register for a 4-credit modern language course.

6. Adjournment. The meeting was adjourned at 4:50 p.m.
