A. Chairman Ryan has been in communication with Prof. Lieblieh, Chairman of the B.C.C. Governance Committee re: Curriculum Committee procedures.

B. The B.C.C. Senate approved all Curriculum Committee items with the exception of LTL.

C. The Dept. of Communication Arts and Sciences announced their intention of ending CMS 12 experiment of 3 rec/2 credit. As of the Spring 1989 semester, CMS 12 will again carry 2 rec/2 hr.

D. Dean Fuller reviewed the timetable for submission of curriculum matters to the Chancellor's Report.

V. Old Business


- A. Prof. Shopkow answered questions about revisions in DAT 40, 41 and 43 and two new courses: OS/Job Control Language and Macintosh Facilities. No action was taken.
- B. Prof. Smith answered questions about the proposed new course- Physical Assessment of the Adult. No action was taken.

VI. New Business

- A. Prof. McLaughlin of the Department of Engineering Technology made the first distribution for a revision of courses in the Electrical Technology Curriculum, AAS, with one attendant new course: Advanced Electronics, 3 lec/lab, 4 cr. and the revision of 5 courses; ELC11, ELC35, ELC81, ELC92 and MEC 10. Prof. McLaughlin received questions.
- B. Prof. Shopkow proposed approval of 2 new Business Administration options: Banking and Credit, AAS, and Banking and Finance, AAS. with a reduction in the 68-69 credits previously presented to the Curriculum Committee. Procedural rules were waived to allow the Committee to go directly to a discussion of these options. No action was taken since they had been presented to the Committee on 4/19/88 and 5/17/88. Action possible on 10/25/88.

VII. The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 P.M. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 25, at 2:15 in the South hall Conference Room
